Student visa

If you require a Student visa to study in the UK, you will need to ensure that you have the following before you make your visa application:

- A CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies) number from the University.
- The original documents used to obtain your offer (including English language qualification).
- Evidence confirming you have enough money available to cover your course fees and monthly living costs (for more information please read the section entitled 'Money you need' of the [GOV.UK](https://www.gov.uk) website: <https://www.gov.uk/student-visa>)

You will need to complete an on-line CAS request form before we can issue your CAS: please log on to the University's online application system, [OneUni](#), using your application ID shown above and password you registered with and access the 'My Details' function, in the 'Forms' tab. This form can be completed up to four months before the start of the course.

Please note, if you are currently in the UK and will be using your CAS to request further permission to remain in the UK, you can request your CAS up to three months before the start of your course.

Stage 1 - a deposit of **£8,000** is due after you accept an unconditional offer and before we issue you with a CAS number.

Stage 2 – the balance of fees is to be paid in a single instalment before the end of the first semester.
