- Minimum financial deposit payment of £1,500 (this is deducted from the 'Tuition Fees Due' amount below.) When making payment please quote your University of Chester student number as reference. Please note, you will still be required to meet a total £5,000 deposit requirement in order to receive your CAS, so we recommend you make this payment at the earliest opportunity
- Provide clear scan copy of all semester marksheets.
- Provide UG degree certificate.
