



TRANSCRIPT

EXPLANATORY NOTES

1. The medium of instruction for the entire B.E. Programme is English
2. The transcript contains complete record of academic performance of a student during his/her stay in the college. Detailed regulations, schemes of study and course syllabi are given in the booklet entitled Academic Regulations and Courses of Study in the Faculty of Engineering & Technology issued separately by Sardar Patel University.
3. The credits assigned to a course, shown under the CREDITS (CR) column in the transcript, indicate the relative weightage of a course in the B.E. degree programme. The credits also reflect the weekly workload associated with a course.
4. The LEVEL of a course indicates the year in which the course is offered in the student's degree programme. An average student will typically complete the first level courses in the first year, second level courses in the second year, and so on. An above average student may complete the courses at a faster rate, while a below average student may complete the courses at a slower rate.
5. Some courses in the student's degree programme are shown as having a PREREQUISITE (PREQ) course. If a course X has a prerequisite course Y, then it means that a student cannot register in X until he/she has completed Y with atleast a grade DE or FF but not WD or LA.

The overall performance of a student in a course is measured in terms of letter grades AA, AB, BB, BC, CC, CD, DD, DE and FF. Each letter grade has a qualitative meaning and an equivalent grade point value as indicated.	AA	Outstanding	10

7. A student is permitted to have not more than one DE grade at each level of courses. A larger number of DE grades entails repetition of courses until the student is left with no more than the permitted number of DE grades. Also, a student may voluntarily repeat any course in which he/she has obtained DE grade, regardless of the number of DE grades obtained by the student in other courses, before completion of degree.
8. A student's repeated attempts in a course are shown in the transcript by multiple entries in the GRADE column of the transcript. The last semester in which a student registered for a course is listed under the column LAST ATTEMPT (LAST ATT) in the format YY/SEM, where YY indicates the academic year and SEM indicates the semester. Other notations used in the transcript are :

EX: Exempted from the course

LA: Low attendance

WD : Withdrawn from the course.

CPI – Cumulative Performance Index – is the weighted average of course grade points obtained by the student for all the courses in which he/she has registered since his/her admission.

9. AWARD OF CLASS :

The class awarded to a student with his/her B.E. degree is decided by his/her final CPI (calculated from Second, Third and Fourth Level courses) as follows :

FIRST CLASS with DISTINCTION CPI not less than 8.25

FIRST CLASS CPI less than 8.25 but not less than 6.75

SECOND CLASS CPI less than 6.75 but not less than 5.50

PASS CLASS CPI less than 5.50 but not less than 4.00

10. Students having CPI in the range of 8.20 to 8.24 will be awarded First Class with Distinction, students having CPI in the range of 6.70 to 6.74 will be awarded First Class and students having CPI 5.45 to 5.49 will be awarded Second Class with the notation "26.02" shown against the class awarded.

11. $\text{Equivalent Percentage} = -0.2015 * (\text{CPI})^3 + 4.545 * (\text{CPI})^2 - 23.896 * (\text{CPI}) + 76.19$

12. $\text{Equivalent GPA out of 4} = -0.0144 * (\text{CPI})^3 + 0.306 * (\text{CPI})^2 - 1.67 * (\text{CPI}) + 4.5$
